THE LOUISVILLE LINK-UP

The Milwaukee Road now operates its freight trains directly into Louisville.

When you consider that we already operated all the way from the Pacific Northwest to southeastern Indiana, the 78 more miles to Louisville may not seem like a lot. But when you also consider that Louisville is an important Gateway to the South, you can see why a little bit farther does mean a lot.
