

THE LATE MR. MITCHELL.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., April 22.—The special train bearing the remains of the Hon. Alexander Mitchell steamed through a drizzling rain to the Union Station at 3 o'clock this morning. The lateness of the hour caused any attempt on the part of old friends at meeting the train to be abandoned and only a little knot of railway employes gathered at the side of the train as it came to a standstill. The funeral party, consisting of Mr. and Mrs. John L. Mitchell, Drs. Keene and Mackie, were escorted to carriages in waiting and proceeded at once to the Mitchell residence. The remains were taken in charge by the committee, consisting of Assistant General Manager Tucker, General Freight Agent Bird, and Superintendents Olin and Clinton, who had accompanied them from Chicago. By them the remains were escorted to the residence, where they were transferred to a committee consisting of Secretary Meyer, Treasurer Rainey, Assistant General Superintendent Earling, and Assistant General Passenger Agent Hefford, by whom they were received and deposited in the apartment prepared for them, where they will remain until the arrangements for the funeral shall have been completed.
