

# PENSIONS FOR RAILROADERS.

**Plan Will Be Submitted to Officers and Men of Western Road.**

CHICAGO, May 4.—Next month J. A. Hinsey will submit for the consideration of the Directors and employes of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railway system a plan for the establishment of a pension and relief department.

Mr. Hinsey's plan is to fix the salaries received at the time of retirement from active service as the basic point for pensions, and to provide for the compulsory retirement of an employe who has reached the age of seventy years and for the optional retirement of an employe who has lived threescore years. He would have the benefits received from the relief department based on the amounts paid into the fund by the employes.

If Mr. Hinsey's plan is adopted, the employes will make monthly contributions to the relief fund, and the railroad company will set aside a fixed amount of money annually.
