EIGHT SURVEYING PARTIES WORKING FOR GOVERNMENT

Helena, May 24.—Eight parties are now in the field at work on 1,900,000 acres of land the government proposes to survey in Montana this year. It is the intention, says J. Scott Harrison, assistant supervisor of surveys, to put at least two more public land survey crews in the field and from two to

at least two more public land survey crows in the field and from two to four special parties in the forest reserve, providing engineers can be found who are competent to take charge of them.

The register of the civil service has been exhausted and now, unless special authority is obtained to employ other engineers, it will be impossible to put more crews in the field. About 200 engineers took examination, but only 19 qualified. Some who failed are said to be competent to do the work, but they fell down when it came to theory.

Plans have been made to survey approximately 1,035,860 acres of public land and 875,529 acres of Northern Pacific lands. The railroad has made demosits to defray the cost of the work. Most of the work will be carried on in the western part of the state, where lands listed for the last three years for survey were temporarily passed in favor of lands in Eastern Montana.
