

## Michigan Road's President May Be Out.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., May 21.—It is rumored among the employes of the Milwaukee Road that President Albert J. Earling has tendered his resignation and severed his relations with the road, with which he has been connected since he was old enough to draw a salary. Just what authority there is for the rumor cannot be learned, but, as it is known that Mr. Earling was recently overruled by Eastern interests in the matter of appointments to official positions, as well as in some other things, there is believed to be some ground for the report. By the Eastern interests the railway people mean Roswell Miller, who has never taken his hands off the reins.
