Dear Sir:-- ATTENTION: Mr. C. A. Goodnow, Ass't., to Pres.

The undersigned desires to call your attention to the fact that the maximum demand for electric power used by you in connection with the electric operation of your Railway in Montana, is in excess of the amount of 10,000 kilowatts provided for by the contract between you and the undersigned, dated November 25, 1912. Article 2 of said contract provides as follows:-

"The Power Company hereby sells and agrees to deliver to the Railway Company, and the Railway Company hereby buys and agrees to receive from the Power Company, electric power or energy for operating its Railway equal to but not at any one time exceeding, except as provided for in Art. 9, 10, 11 and 12, - 10,000 kilowatts for the full period of this agreement."

The undersigned, appreciating the difficulty of accurately determining the power requirements during the initial stages of operations, does not insist that any of the options contained in said contract under which the Railway Company may take power in addition to the 10,000 kilowatts specifically provided for, be exercised by the Railway Company at this time, or before December 3, 1918, but on the other hand it does not wish that by furnishing power in excess of the amount contracted for, it shall be deemed to have waived any of the terms or provisions of said contract of November 25, 1912, nor to have consented to any change or amendment to any of the terms or provisions of said contract.
